SMSC Self-Advocacy Board Special Award Ceremony

During a recent Mobility Training, eight SMSC students and two staff were on their way to Seaport Village when in the process of boarding the doors of the trolley malfunctioned. As the doors shut too quickly, four students were locked out. However, the misadventure was stopped in its tracks due to the actions of Janae Horn and Luis Herrera. Due to their extensive training, they remained calm and took charge of helping the other students to keep everyone safe. "I wasn't scared. I knew what to do. I calmed the other students while we waited for staff to come and help us", Janae said proudly. SMSC People First Board held a special ceremony to honor Janae and Luis with certificates for being trustworthy and good citizens, and for being responsible and doing the right thing.

SMSC Job Coach, Barbara Holland-Alderman has been teaching students how to ride the trolley including changing lines and using their passes. "Mobility training is vital in giving people with intellectual and developmental disabilities the skills they need to be more independent", Barbara said. Adding that all her training kicked in that day and that she was proud of the way the students handled the situation. "I remind my students every trip, that if they become separated from their group while on the trolley they should sit on the nearest bench and wait. "Stay put, stay safe, and don't panic. The group stayed safe because they followed these directions", Holland remarked.

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Latina Pilot Soars



When you realize that women account for 9.57% of pilots flying today, the story of Major Marisol Chalas is especially inspirational. Within that 9.57% of female pilots, only 1% are Latina. Major Marisol is the first Latina National Guard Black Hawk helicopter pilot, who also has a six sigma Black Belt Certification, Chalas was born in the Dominican Republic and moved to Massachusetts in 1982 with her family. She enlisted in the Army National Guard during high school and was commissioned as an aviation officer in 2001. Chalas became first in her class at Fort Rucker Army Aviation School where she earned more than a dozen awards, including the Senior **Aviator** Badge. Of the 3,000 pilots that flew Black Hawks, she was one of 120 female pilots.



The Sikorsky UH-60 Black Hawk is a four-blade, twin-engine, medium-lift utility military helicopter manufactured by Sikorsky Aircraft. The aircraft was first flown in 1974 and is still in use today. It is the primary tactical transport helicopter for the United States Military and is used in other militaries around the world!
