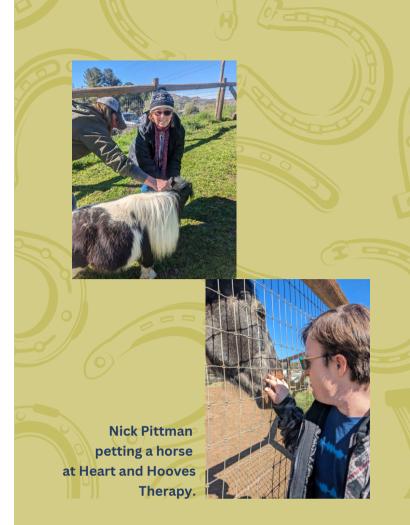

Melissa Sargent discovered a sense of wellbeing working around horses as she groomed, fed, and cleaned their stalls. This experience at a young age led her to open Heart and Hooves Therapy, known for its program of Work Readiness for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities. "My partnership with SMSC began when I started bringing mini horses to your campus in 2018", she remarked. "Your students have attended my Work Readiness program at my farm since 2019, where they go once a week for 17 weeks of training." Work Readiness includes safety, relating to others, and self-advocacy as they are taught animal care. They are taught how to overcome fear, confidence building, and how to work as a team", Sargent said. After the 17week course, graduates are given a certificate, a pizza party, and plenty of recognition! Sargent's program is so successful that she has added teams by training local and national affiliate programs.

XO Ranch is a new program located in Descanso that is focused on building personal growth while caring for animals and learning horsemanship skills. The owner Kim Bishop was trained by Heart and Hooves Therapy. SMSC students Monica Burns and Robert Gibson completed their volunteer program at XO Ranch and received evaluations by Kim, owner of the program. Both students cleaned stalls, groomed animals, and learned how to safely exercise horses. Robert was acknowledged for learning to independently exercise horses around an obstacle course. Kim remarked, "Robert makes the workplace fun!" She added "Monica came to the program with real skills." In her evaluation of Monica, she recommended that Monica would be successful in a paid position at a similar ranch!

Natcat, (National Cat Protection) is an organization located near Alpine that is dedicated to the health and welfare of cats and finding them forever homes. As a shelter they have been fighting for cat protection for 50 years. SMSC sends a group two-days a week to help with caring for their cats. Students help with the mountain of cat blankets that need laundering each day. They measure detergent, rotate wet laundry to the dryer, fold dry cat blankets, sort them into into sizes, and neatly stack them. Lauren, the receptionist at Natcat said, "We count on the groups from SMSC and really appreciate their help." During their free time students get to go into the Cozy Cottage to socialize with the kitties!

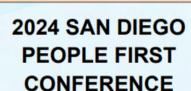

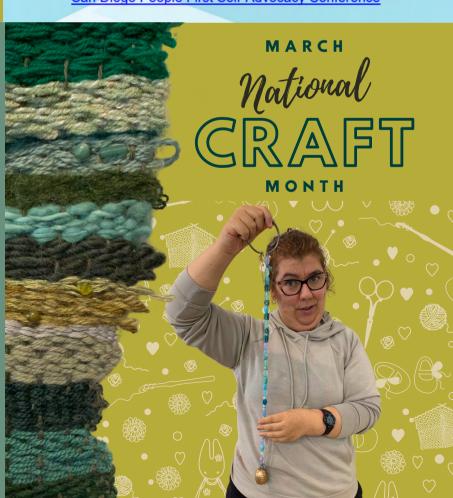

Greta Thunberg Climate Activist

When Greta Thunberg first learned about climate at the age of 8, she could not change understand why so little was being done to prevent it. She became famous after organizing school walkouts protesting inaction on climate change at age 15. She is now 21, yet despite her young age she has challenged world leaders to take immediate action for climate change. Like many change-makers in history Greta has faced push back from authorities. She has been detained by police, removed from protests, and has been found guilty of disobeying police orders. Greta continues to use peaceful activism to call attention to causes she feels are important and was recently nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize. Greta is autistic and has been open about her challenges such as obsessivecompulsive disorder (OCD), and selective mutism. Greta has spoken about her diagnosis saying it makes her "different" but that she considers it a "superpower".

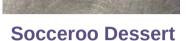

RITCHEN TIME Recipe of the Month





Prep Time 5 minutes Cook Time 3 minutes Total Time 8 minutes Servings 15 pieces

Equipment
9x13 inch baking dish
Ingredients
1 cup sugar 200g
1 cup peanut butter
1 cup corn syrup 240mL
6 cups Rice Krispies
12 oz milk chocolate chips
12 oz butterscotch chips

Instructions

- 1. Prepare a 9x13 inch baking dish either by lining with parchment paper or with a light coating of butter.
- 2. Combine the corn syrup and sugar to a large pot and place over medium heat stirring frequently until sugar is dissolved. Remove from heat once the mixture comes to a boil then stir in peanut butter, mixing until incorporated.
- 3. Add the rice Krispies to the mixture and fold in until thoroughly coated then transfer to your baking dish. Use a spoon or spatula to spread out and smooth.
- 4. Melt the chocolate chips and butterscotch chips to a heatproof bowl either over a pot of simmering water or in 40 second bursts in a microwave, stirring after each burst.
- 5. Spread the chocolate mixture over the base and smooth out. Allow chocolate to set before cutting.
