



## COLEEN BAUCOM PRESENTS-BILLIE ANDERSON



#### Courage to Continue - Courage to Create!

Carmen Herrera was a Abstract Expressionist and Minimalist painter who was born in Havana, Cuba in 1915. She started drawing lessons when she was eight years old and was a life-long artist who lived to be 106. Herrera was a dedicated and disciplined artist who worked in her studio almost everyday. Living in New York City and Paris during her career, she was inspired and sustained by major art movements in both cities. She attended art classes, visited museums, and associated with fellow artists. As an immigrant, Herrera faced discrimination and like other many women artists, she was not taken seriously by the art world. No matter the snub, Carmen continued to paint. Although she rarely exhibited her artwork for the public, her perseverance paid off. She sold her first painting at age 89 and began to receive international recognition late in life. At age 101 her artworks were featured in a retrospective at the Witney Museum in New York City. Her hard-earned place in the art world is reflected in the collections of major museums including the Museum of Modern Art in New York City and the Hirshhorn Museum and Scuplture Garden in Washington DC. Carmen Herrera's life is an inspiration to us all - reminding us to believe in ourselves, to reach for the stars, and never give up!
