

Did you know our AC Program has a volunteer training program with two 7-Eleven locations where they work every day? The partnership started in July of 2024 with 12-week programs that teach daily tasks that are vital to keeping the business running smoothly. Tasks include front facing of all products, checking expiration dates, scanning & reading labels, restocking the back room, freezer, and refrigerators. Participants in the program clean windows and wipe down all counter tops and shelves. They mop, sweep, and sort items for recycling. Recent graduate, Laura Woody shared, "My favorite activities are front facing of stock on the shelves, straightening up the overstock cart, and refilling the coffee creamer at the coffee station." She was one of a group of four that worked at the Los Coaches 7-Eleven adding, "It was fun being with my group, we got closer as friends while working together." SMSC staff are on hand to supervise and answer questions. Laura noted "I could also ask a store manager for suggestions on how to do a job better or ask them for help if I needed it." "We have received nothing but positive feedback from the managers of both locations where we have students working" Eva Tan, AC Program Manager remarked. "They appreciate our volunteers and look forward to working with them every day." Laura's group graduated in February and a new group started in March. With much enthusiasm Laura added, "I enjoyed working at 7-Eleven and asked to be on the substitution list so I can fill in if anyones ever absent!"

I am autistic and am sensitive to loud noises. When noises bother me I like to go somewhere quiet. If you want to learn more about autism, I suggest you google autism for more information.





Earth Day is an annual event to advocate




