SMSC Self-Advocacy Board On-the-Go

State Council on Developmental Disabilities Area Board XIII Emergency Preparation Workshop



Board SMSC Self-Advocacy members attended a disaster preparation workshop held by the State Council on Developmental Disabilities at their Area Board XIII office. Deborah Marshall, Community Program Specialist talked about preparing for natural disasters like earthquakes, fires, and floods. Frederick DeBerg, staff facilitator for the board, was proud of how the students listened, took notes, and asked pertinent questions during the presentation. He commented, "They are eager to learn and to make a difference while serving on the board." Chelse Voisard was excited that she got to go to the workshop as a substitute. "Everyone got an emergency backpack with a flashlight, extra batteries, a hand-held radio, rolls of masking tape, a mini first aid kit, and canned and dried fruit", Chelse remarked. She has an interest in safety and disaster preparation and added, "I gave my two-cents worth every once in a while on the topic!"





Leading the Charge Conference Discovering Connections Through Mentoring! The Case for Giving Grace

Several of SMSC students attended Leading the Charge: Discovering Connections Through Mentoring, a conference put on by Exceptional Family Resource Center and Developmental Disabilities Provider Network. Held at the Doubletree by Hilton Mission Valley, the day offered several sessions to support improving life-outcomes and expanding opportunities for people with developmental and intellectual disabilities. Topics included assistive technology, career and college pathways, and customized employment opportunities. SMSC students attended The Case for Giving Grace, a workshop on how to handle challenging situations with practical strategies. "I thought the presentation was good and wished that I could have reviewed the slides again. The presenter stressed that accidents happen when there are miscommunications and I agree with that", Clayton Hauer remarked. "People need to think about the physical challenges of people with disabilities before building. They should consider ramps to replace stairs and make bathrooms larger", he added.

# My Experience in Sacramento on Grassroots Day

Each year, the Association of Regional Center Agencies (ARCA) organizes Grassroots Day, an event where representatives from California's 21 regional centers come together in Sacramento to advocate for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). This gathering provides a platform to discuss pressing issues, share personal stories, and influence legislative decisions to vote for well-funded accessible services and supports.

SMSC student, Cali Williams was chosen to attend the conference as a Self-Advocacy Board Member for the San Diego Regional Center (SDCR). "I went to Sacramento with a group representing the SDRC for Grassroots Day. During our two-day trip to Sacramento, we had back-to-back meetings with legislators," Cali said. On the first day she attended a meeting that lasted all day until dinnertime. "By-the-way the food was somewhat yummy in my opinion! After a long and fun day my group went back to our hotel room for a nightcap to relax", she remarked. On the second day there were more meetings with Assembly Members. "I gave a speech that my mom helped me write. It was about my personal story and about the bills we want the legislators to pass that will help my life." After her speech everyone had lunch, then it was back to meet with more representatives. "It was a fun experience being at the state capitol to show our support for change. In an Uber to the airport that last day, I thought, yes I kind of want to go back and to do that again!"
